

Make the World a Better Place...: The Edgar Cayce Scholarship Program

Purpose

Edgar Cayce, in a number of his psychic readings, directed humankind to “**make the world a better place for your having lived in it.**” The purpose of this scholarship is to inspire and enable young people of Virginia Beach to incorporate this principle into their career planning, their relationships to self, to family, the global community, and, not the least, to the planet.

Eligible Scholarship applicants are:

- Graduating Virginia Beach high school seniors who have been accepted to a college undergraduate level curriculum.
- Students who have earned a 3.0 or greater Grade Point Average or appropriate equivalent of individual scholastic achievement.

Scholarship Amount – One (1) \$1,000.00 scholarship will be awarded this year.

Criteria

Applicants are required to submit:

- The completed scholarship application
- The applicant’s most recent official high school transcript. (A photocopy of a school transcript will not be accepted.)
- A copy of the acceptance letter from the college that the applicant will attend (listing the major).
- Letters of reference from the three (3) persons who are listed in Part G of the application.

In addition, applicants must write a 500 to 650 word essay following the instructions below. This essay weighs heavily in the applicant selection process.

ESSAY INSTRUCTIONS

Please consider the following principle that appears on a number of occasions in the Edgar Cayce information:

One of the guiding principles in life for each and every individual should be to “Make the world a better place in which to live.”

Write an essay of between 500 and 650 words that addresses either of these questions:

- Have you known someone who has made the world a better place? How did that person influence you and your choice of study?
- How do you see yourself making the world a better place when you complete your studies?

Please note: The essay will be evaluated for quality and thoughtfulness of the subject matter. It should:

- be carefully worded and organized,
- contain vocabulary, grammar and sentence structure on a college-English level,
- stay on topic (we are looking for clear and succinct writing),
- be typed, titled and page numbered.

Use of the Cayce material is encouraged but not required. Applicants are invited to use the A.R.E. library facilities for researching information on their essays.

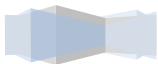

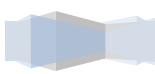

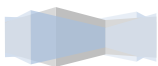
